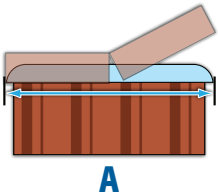


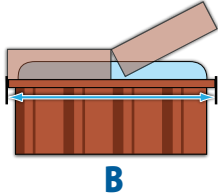
Cover Measuring Guide

When measuring your spa for a replacement cover, it is important to remember that a cover that is slightly larger than your spa will still fit. A cover that is too small will not. If your current cover fits and is not warped or misshapen you can use it as a guide.

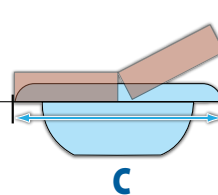
See the following illustration to determine where to start your measurements.



A: For spa cabinets with no rail measure from outside edge of the acrylic lip



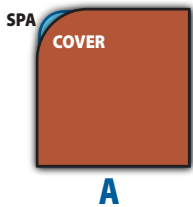
B: For spa cabinets with a rail measure from outside edge of the rail



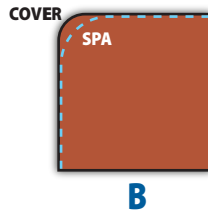
C: For in-ground spas measure from widest points above the ground

Record all measurements in inches. Add an inch to the final edge-to-edge dimension for both length and width. This will give you a 1/2" of play all the way around.

RADIUS: To measure the radius use this page as a reference. Simply lay the template over the corner of you spa and select the closest size. When in doubt it is better to use a smaller radius (see illustration below).



A: Radius of the cover is too large so it will not fit over the spa



B: Radius of the cover is too small but it still fits over the spa

SKIRT: The skirt needs to be long enough to cover the acrylic (the thick plastic part of the spa). This protects it from UV damage. The standard skirt length is 4". If you have a rail around the cabinet of your spa the cover needs to be wide enough for the skirt to hang flat. A skirt that is too long can bunch and push the spa cover up.

FOLD DIRECTION: The fold generally bisects the longest side unless requested otherwise.
